# **Free Adoption Information and Services**

Anything you say about sex, drugs, and your feelings is confidential unless you tell us: You are being abused

You are going to hurt yourself or someone else

Emergency Contraception (EC) is known as the morning-after pill. There are different brands available: Plan B, Next Choice and Ella. It can prevent pregnancy up to 5 days after unprotected sex. Be prepared, request EC from your clinic along with your regular birth control method

EC is available at most clinics and some pharmacies. www.not-2-late.com lists local clinics & pharmacies that provide

EC is FREE for those with a prescription and an up-to-date Family PACT or Medi-Cal card. For those paying cash, cost will vary.

As of June 30, 2013, a prescription is required for those less than 17 years to obtain EC but it is likely that new rules will go into effect later this year. Check with your pharmacy.

## Safely Surrendered Baby Law: www.babysafe.ca.gov

A parent who is unable or unwilling to care for their new baby can legally, confidentially, and safely give up their child within 3 days of birth. No name or other information must be given. The baby should be brought to a hospital emergency room.
